## Fundraising

Individual fundraising for travel may be offered by the Music Department. Students may choose not to participate, but are responsible for earning funds another way if they travel with us. Money fundraised goes into each student's individual fundraising account. This account balance may be applied to any Music Department Travel. Upon graduation, unused funds may be transferred to a family member music student, or become part of the general fund to decrease the cost of everyone's trip. Student account balances will be available after each fundraiser, and by request throughout the year.

## Sacred Music Statement

It is the position of NAfME: The National Association for Music Education that the study and performance of religious music within an educational context is a vital and appropriate part of a comprehensive music education. The omission of sacred music form the school curriculum would result in an incomplete education experience.

The First Amendment does not forbid all mention of religion in the public schools: it prohibits the advancement or inhibition of religion by the state. A second clause in the First Amendment prohibits the infringement of religious beliefs. The public schools are not required to delete from the curriculum all materials that may offend any religious sensitivity. For instance the study of art history would be incomplete without references to the Sistine Chapel, and the study of architecture requires an examination of Renaissance cathedrals.

Likewise, a comprehensive study of music includes an obligation to become familiar with choral music set to religious texts. Since music with a sacred text or of a religious origin (particularly choral music) constitutes such a substantial portion of music literature and has such an important place in the history of music, it should and does have an important place in music education. The key to an adequate solution rests ultimately with the sensitive and well-informed music educator. -Excerpted from the NAfME Position Statement on Sacred Music in Schools. ## WSMA State Honor Choir:

## What is it?

The WSMA State Honors Choirs are made up of the state's top singers. This is the highest honor a musician can receive in the state. Being a member of the State Honors Choir means that you are the best of the best!

How are the choirs selected?
The choirs are selected by a rigorous audition process the year prior to the event. Only freshmen, sophomores and juniors are eligible to audition. Applications are due to the WSMA office before December 1, and there is an application fee. Students and their families are responsible for completing the application process. Your teacher cannot register for you!

## What is the audition like?

The audition consists of four parts:
Solo Performance
sing a class A solo, accurately memorized and performed musically and emotionally
Vocalization
sing up and down the scale displaying good range and tone production
Sight Reading
sing your voice part in a four part chorale accurately and musically with a taped accompaniment Ear Training echo the melodic patterns played on a tape accurately and musically

## Should I audition?

Anyone who would like to improve their reading skills, learn their solo early and follow through is encouraged to audition.

When should I begin?
NOW!!!! If you are a weak sight reader, I would begin there. If you have never sung a solo for festival, I would choose one soon. Sign up for extra lessons so Mrs. Armstrong can help you!
